MOLINA/RUDY FAMILY FUND SIGNS ON AS TITLE SPONSOR OF THE 13th ANNUAL LONG BEACH MAYOR'S TROPHY

LONG BEACH, CA (March 26, 2019) – The non-profit Long Beach Century Club announced today that the Molina/Rudy Family Fund led by Heather Rudy and Josephine Molina will serve as the Title Sponsor of the 13th Annual Long Beach Mayor's Trophy Charity Golf Tournament, which will be hosted by Long Beach Mayor Robert Garcia on Thursday, May 2, at Skylinks Golf Course. Since 2006, the Long Beach Mayor's Trophy has raised more than \$1 million for Long Beach-area non-profit organizations that work to improve lives and enrich the community.

"Education and healthy development through sports go hand in hand in cultivating our next generation of leaders, and I look forward to welcoming everyone to Skylinks on May 2 for an exciting day of great golf, great food, and charitable giving."

The Mayor's Trophy will include a handicap scramble-format charity golf tournament with on-course contests and activities, including a hole-in-one contest for \$10,000; a hole-in-one contest for a Mercedes-Benz; lunch on the course provided by more than a dozen top Long Beach restaurants; and an awards dinner hosted by Mayor Garcia featuring entertainment by Gregg Young and the 2nd Street Band, dinner donated by The Boathouse on the Bay, and live and silent auctions.
