MAJOR EVENTS

The Long Beach Century Club hosts three major events throughout the year: (1) An annual Sports Night Banquet when outstanding Long Beach based athletes are inducted into a Hall of Fame. We recognize athletes of the year and the top student-athletes in all sports from the high schools, community college, and local university. (2) An annual banquet to honor the student-athletes participating in LBUSD's middle school sports program. Each winning team member receives recognition that will "last a lifetime." (3) The Long Beach Mayor's Trophy Golf Tournament, which financially supports local athletic programs and creates scholarships for graduating high school student-athletes.



To date, they offer baseball, basketball, boccia (rhymes with gotcha) and Dance to children and young adults from age five up. No one ever ages out and no one is turned away. Cynthia is the President and CEO of the Playmakers and very quick to mention everything that happens is a team effort. Every person is a volunteer so each minute of effort has been a gift that has helped build Playmakers into what is today. They



They have over 200 families in their data base and run several 6-10 weeks sports sessions every year. The decision about which sports and what times are based on feedback from their families. Fun fact: the buddies who help them run their baseball programs are the baseball teams from five Long Beach high schools who show up in full uniform at what is an early time on Saturday mornings for teenagers... and they play with the kids. 
BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF LONG BEACH

JIM HERRICK AWARD

Jim Herrick represented the qualities of toughness, character, and leadership throughout his decorated sports career in Long Beach, and the Century Club's award in his name is going to an athlete in his mold.

DAYLEN CAREY BASEBALL

Daylen Carey had an outstanding senior campaign at Poly. After dealing with injuries earlier in his career, Carey moved to pitcher for the Jackrabbits for his senior year, and excelled. He earned first-team All-Moore League honors while maintaining a high GPA, earning a scholarship to Westmont College.



"Going to a Christian college was my priority, not baseball actually," he said. "My brother and my dad went to Westmont so it was a family thing—I went to a baseball camp there and the coach called me the next day. It wasn't my only option, but it was the one I was most interested in. It was where I wanted to go."



Carey excelled on the field as well as in the classroom. He led Poly to a thrilling walk-off playoff win over Mayfair throwing a complete game with just one run and four hits, and also hitting the walk-off hit in the bottom of the seventh to seal the victory for the Jackrabbits.

JIM KNAUB AWARD

Presented to an individual that has overcome severe obstacles in achieving life-long goals.

TOM GALLAGHER

Tom Gallagher was born and raised in Long Beach. He began his athletic journey playing flag football at Jefferson Jr. High, but after breaking his back in the 8th grade, doctors advised him to stop playing football. Undeterred, he switched to water polo and swimming at Wilson High School. He went on to play three years of college water polo at UC Santa Barbara. On a whim, Tom entered the Santa Barbara Half Ironman Triathlon—and won it. He quickly found success in the emerging sport of triathlon,



racing professionally from 1984 to 1992 and achieving world rankings in the top ten. In one of the most memorable moments of his career, he was hit by a taxi during the last mile of the bike segment at the Hawaiian Ironman. Despite the accident, which forced him to run the final mile with his bike before starting the marathon, he finished 13th overall in what was then the world's biggest triathlon.

After his racing career, Tom started a sports chiropractic practice in Belmont Shore, where he has been serving the community for 34 years. In his mid-40s, he transitioned to paddling water sports and once again found success, winning the Molokai World Championship and consistently ranking in the top ten in stand-up paddleboarding (SUP).

In 2010, he underwent bone spur removal surgery in his shoulder, during which the Doctor accidentally transected half of his Spinal Cord. This resulted in Brown-Séquard Syndrome, and a 3.5/5 class spinal injury. He lost all feeling on the left side of his body from the armpit down, and the right side experienced a 30% loss in muscle strength and balance.

Despite these challenges, Tom used water sports and his work as essential components of his rehabilitation and recovery. Although he placed last in a few races during his early comeback, his persistence paid off—he eventually began winning again. Now in his 34th year of full-time chiropractic practice, Tom takes great pride in helping others recover from injuries and return to healthy, active lives. He continues to paddle and cycle almost daily, never letting his disability hinder his pursuit of an active lifestyle.

LONG BEACH CENTURY CLUB CO-COACHES OF THE YEAR AWARD

GIVEN ANNUALLY TO ONE OR MORE LONG BEACH-BASED COACHES WHO HAVE EXEMPLIFIED THE TEACHING OF SPORTSMANSHIP, INTEGRITY, AND CHARACTER TO THE YOUNG PEOPLE UNDER THEIR CHARGE.

LATANYA SHEFFIELD

LaTanya Sheffield, a former Olympian and American record holder, is in her 13th season at Long Beach State and her third as the head men's and women's track coach. She works with all of the sprinters, hurdlers, and relay teams. Of high demand on the International stage, Sheffield served as Head Women's Coach for Team USA at the 2024 Paris Olympics. In addition to her head coaching responsibilities she worked with Team USA's Sprinters and Hurdlers at the Paris Games. Team USA won seven gold medals, five silvers, and four bronze during the meet. Sheffield was named the USA National Team Women's Head Coach for the 2022 World Championships in the summer. She has also been selected twice to lead the United States women's national team's sprints, hurdles, and relays at both the 2016 Rio and 2020 Tokyo Olympics, and also led the entire women's track and field program as Team USA won 18 combined medals at the 2019 Pan American Games. Sheffield's international prominence has continued to grow following her time at the Beach. Making an immediate impact, during her time at Long Beach State, the team has won seven championships in 10 years, with the men claiming five titles and the women claiming back-to-back titles in 2022 and 2023. Since 2013, Sheffield has mentored 15 Big West Champions, sent 11 to the NCAA championships, and has seen her charges qualify for the NCAA western preliminaries in 41 events.



GAVIN ARROYO

An icon of the sport, Gavin Arroyo enters his 19th season as the Head Men's Water Polo Coach at Long Beach State in 2025. Arroyo has established himself as one of the premier coaches at both the collegiate and international level and was recognized for his excellence within the sport with induction into the USA Water Polo Hall of Fame in 2020. This past summer, Arroyo completed a cycle with the USA Men's National team, helping lead the squad to a Bronze Medal finish at the 2024 Paris Olympics, the first Olympic medal for the program in 16 years. That marked the second straight Olympic appearance for Arroyo, who also served as an Assistant Coach for the USA men at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. Arroyo has led Long Beach State to the NCAA postseason in three of the last six seasons, finished ranked in the Top 15 in each of the last 10 years and has posted a winning record in all but one season since 2011, ultimately compiling a 294-216 overall record as the head coach of the Men's Water Polo program at the Beach. This past season, Long Beach State made its 14th NCAA Tournament appearance and the third in the last six seasons under Arroyo, as the Beach won the Big West Championship tournament and advanced to the postseason behind the play of four All-Americans, earning Big West Coach of the Year for the first time since the league re-sponsored the sport in 2023.

Long Beach has always been known as a Water Polo City. THIS FACT COULD NOT HAVE BEEN BETTER DISPLAYED THAN AT THE 2024 Olympic Games in Paris. Four players from Long Beach MADE THE OLYMPIC TEAM. HANNES DAUBE, MAX IRVING, CHASE DODD AND RYDER DODD ALL LIST LONG BEACH AS THEIR HOME town on the USA Water Polo Website, and led the U.S. Squad TO A BRONZE MEDAL, THE FIRST OLYMPIC MEDAL FOR THE U.S. WATER POLO TEAM SINCE TONY AZEVEDO LED THE TEAM TO A SILVER MEDAL AT THE 2008 OLYMPICS IN BEIJING. INCREDIBLY, THESE FOUR ATHLETES SCORED A WHOPPING 47% OF THE TEAM U.S.A. GOALS IN PARIS! BUT IT WASN'T JUST SCORING, THEY CONTRIBUTED SIGNIFICANTLY TO OTHER AREAS LIKE ASSISTS, FIELD BLOCKS, AND DRAWN EXCLUSIONS. IN THE MODERN ERA OF International water polo, no city in the United States has EVER HAD FOUR WATER POLO PLAYERS ON AN OLYMPIC MEDAL WINNING TEAM. FOR THIS REMARKABLE RESULT, THE CENTURY CLUB IS PROUD TO NAME ALL FOUR PLAYERS AS THE CITY'S ATHLETES OF THE YEAR.

SOME QUICK FACTS ON THE FOUR:

HANNES DAUBE

Hannes is a two-time Olympian and a prolific scorer. He finished the Paris Olympics with a team-high 18 goals and was named to the World Aquatics Media All-Star Team at the 2024 Paris Olympics. Hannes was a three-time All-American and NCAA Champion at USC. Hannes started his water polo career at Shore Aquatics and led Shore's 12 and under team.

MAX IRVING

Max is a two-time Olympian, consummate team player and leader for the U.S. squad. Max scored 12 goals at the Paris Olympics. In College, Max played for Adam Wright at UCLA, earning First Team All-American Honors and three NCAA Championships. A Long Beach native, Max was a First Team All-American in 2012 at Wilson High School. He led the Bruins to a CIF Division II Championship. Max played for Shore Aquatics until graduating from high school.

CHASE DODD

Chase made his Olympic debut at the 2024 Paris Olympics. Chase is an extremely fast and strong player. He contributes to the team in all phases of the game. He scored three goals for the U.S. team in Paris including one key goal in the Bronze medal match. He was named MVP of the Gold Medal match at the 2022 FINA International Cup. His younger brother Ryder was also a member of the USA Olympic team in Paris. "Having my little brother on the team is the best thing you could ever hope for," Chase told the 562.org. It's always been my dream to go to the Olympics and to do it with him makes it that much sweeter." Chase played for Shore Aquatics' 10 and under team.

RYDER DODD

Ryder made his debut with the Senior National Team when he was 16 years old and at 18, became the youngest member of the 2024 Men's Olympic team, where he scored eight goals for the United States. Ryder did it all during his freshman season at UCLA: NCAA Champion, Peter J. Cutino Award winner (for best men's collegiate player in the nation), NCAA player of the year, NCAA Tournament Most Outstanding Player and he set the MPSF single-season record for goals scored with 102. In high school, Ryder earned First Team All-CIF honors, leading JSerra to the Division 1 championship. Ryder's first memory of playing water polo was as a youngster attending his brother Chase's games at Shore Aquatics. Their mom, Janet, asked Ryder if he wanted to try the game. "I said sure, and she just kinda plopped me in the pool and I started playing from there at six years old," Ryder told the 562.org with a laugh.

All four players are competing for a spot on the USA Olympic Team in 2028.



TARA CROSS-BATTLE

Tara Cross-Battle is one of the best volleyball players in the history of the city, country, and the game globally. She won two CIF-SS/State championships in high school before signing to Long Beach State as the top recruit in the nation. She went on to record more kills (2767) than any male or female player in NCAA history at that time, and hold nearly every Long Beach State record.



She led the 49ers to their first-ever NCAA Division 1 championship in 1989 and was named NCAA National Player of the Year in 1988 and 1989. She was also named All-American four times and was on the All-Decade team for the 1980s.

Cross-battle played professionally overseas in Italy and Brazil for more than a decade, and made history as the first-ever USA four-time volleyball Olympian, representing the Americans in 1992, 1996, 2000, and 2004.

Cross-Battle is a member of many Halls of Fame including the International Volleyball Hall of Fame, the Southern California Volleyball Hall of Fame, and the Long Beach State Hall of Fame. We are honored to induct one of the best volleyball players and Long Beach athletes of all time into the Century Club Hall of Fame this evening.



LASHINDA DEMUS

In the long and storied history of track and field in Long Beach, few have reached the heights that Lashinda Demus did. She was a star at Wilson High, setting the national high school record in the 300 hurdles as well as on the 4x400 national record team. Demus won state titles in in the 100 and 300 hurdles, as well as on the Bruins' state champion relays. She was named Track and Field News' National Girls' Athlete of the Year twice for her dominance in high school.



She then went on to the University of South Carolina where she won three NCAA titles and was on the school's first team NCAA champion in 2002.

Demus was an Olympian in 2004, a world champion in the 400 hurdles and 4x400 in 2009 and 2011, and then in London, an Olympic champion in the 400 hurdles. She finished second in the event to an athlete later disqualified for doping. Demus got her Olympic gold medal in Paris when the wrong was corrected by the IOC.

After reaching her sport's highest heights, Demus has returned to her roots as a high school coach in Southern California, where she's helping to mentor the next generation. We're proud to induct her into the Century Club Hall of Fame.



VANIA KING

Vania King grew up in Long Beach and attended Long Beach Poly, where from a young age she followed in the footsteps of another legendary tennis hero: Billie Jean King.

Vania grew up to more than establish her own name, reaching a world ranking of No. 3 in doubles and No. 50 in singles, winning the Wimbledon and US Open doubles titles in



2010 with partner Yaroslava Shvedova. King went on to claim 15 doubles titles on the WTA Tour, as well as a singles WTA Tour title at the 2006 Bangkok Open.

While injuries cut King's career short, she has continued to be a big influence in the local sports world through her charitable endeavors, most noticeably ACEing Autism. She brought the program to Poly where it has continued to help mentor and serve kids from all around Long Beach over the last decade.

For her incredible accomplishments on and off the court, we are proud to induct Vania King into the Hall of Fame this evening.



PATTY GASSO

While growing up in the nearby city of Torrance, Patty's legendary career and success has always been connected to Long Beach. Her playing days consisted of being a strong throwing infielder at California State University Long Beach, and coaching success followed at Long Beach City College from 1990 to 1994. While at LBCC, Patty's teams compiled a record of 161–59–1 earning four conference and two regional titles. During that time she was named the California Coach of the Year and the National Fastpitch Coaches Association West Regional Coach of the Year.



Mickey Davis, the Women's Athletic Director at LBCC at the time was instrumental in bringing Patty to LBCC. Mickey recalled, "I was able to observe her coaching style, knowledge of the game, and ability to recruit. We were fortunate to have her at LBCC, but when Oklahoma's Athletic Director Marietta Hines called asking me for three names, I told her I only had one, and that was Patty. I shared with Oklahoma that she would take care of their players and when she recruits, she would recruit not just the athlete, but the whole family. She was ready for the Division I level and I knew LBCC's loss would become Oklahoma's gain." Mickey's foresight and passion for helping others succeed resulted in something special for the Sooners.

After five seasons at Long Beach City College, Patty accepted the head coaching post at the University of Oklahoma where she continues to coach and set national records. In 30 years at the University of Oklahoma, she has compiled a career record of 1,515–352–2, creating a winning percentage of .811. Her teams have advanced to the Women's College World Series fourteen times and won the national softball championship eight times in 2000, 2013, 2016, 2017, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024. Historically, no other NCAA softball program has four consecutive national titles. A national powerhouse is the only way to describe the Oklahoma softball program under Patty's leadership.

Patty is married to her husband Jim who has decades of coaching experience at the NCAA Division I, community college, and high school levels. Their son JT serves as an assistant coach for the Oklahoma Sooners working with both the outfielders and the offensive game. Her other son DJ is currently an assistant coach with the University of Utah serving as the team's hitting coach. Not only are Patty and Jim proud of their boys, but are also proud grandparents to Joseph and Grace.

Just last February, the latest accolade for Patty Gasso includes being named the head coach of the United States Women's National Softball team through the 2028 quadrennial cycle. Tonight, the Long Beach City Century Club is thrilled to add one more honor to her illustrious resume as we induct her into our Hall of Fame. Congratulations Patty Gasso on your continued dedication and passion for the sport of softball.

BRILLANA BOYD BASKETBALL


Long Beach City College's Brillana Boyd has been named the 2024 Female Athlete of the Year following a historic two-year run with the Vikings women's basketball program. Boyd, who recently signed her National Letter of Intent to play NCAA Division I basketball at St. Bonaventure University, leaves LBCC as one of the most accomplished players in program history. A two-time South Coast Conference Player of the Year, Boyd surpassed 1,000 career points and 400 rebounds during her Viking career. In her sophomore season, she averaged 21.9 points, 8.9 rebounds, and 2.0 assists per game while shooting an impressive 47.6% from



the field. Her freshman year was equally strong, contributing 17.0 points, 7.1 rebounds, and 34% shooting from three-point range. Boyd's consistent dominance on the court, highlighted by back-to-back Player of the Year honors and her all-around impact in scoring, rebounding, and defense, cements her legacy as a standout student-athlete and a deserving recipient of the LBCC Female Athlete of the Year award.

SANDRO PUEYO WATER POLO

A dominant force in the pool, Sandro Pueyo capped off an exceptional season by being named the 2024 South Coast Conference Most Valuable Player. He helped lead the Vikings to a 3rd-place finish at the 3C2A State Championships and earned a spot on the All-State Tournament First Team. Over the 2024 season, Sandro tallied an impressive stat line: 101 goals, 35 assists, 46 steals, 30 drawn ejections, and 7 blocks. His relentless work ethic has earned him a transfer to NCAA Division I program CSU Long Beach, where he will continue his water polo career this fall.

Long Beach State enters the Big West Championship with a 26–2 overall record with Nikolov leading the way. The freshman setter is averaging 9.86 assists per game while guiding the team to .399 hitting, but is a completely unique player, fourth on the team in kills with 142 on the season on .385 hitting, leading the Beach with 139 digs and closing in on the Long Beach State, Big West and NCAA Records with 86 service aces on the year.

AYA MCLYN POLY SOCCER & FLAG FOOTBALL

It's hard to make history in high school sports in Long Beach, and especially at Long Beach Poly. No high school in California has won more championships or produced more great athletes than Poly--but no Jackrabbit has done what Aaya McLyn did this year.

The era of multi-sport athletes (like All-State football/basketball players Willie McGinest and Marcedes Lewis or All-State basketball/baseball players like Tony Gwynn) has largely come to a close. But what McLyn did for Poly this year has never been duplicated, and likely never will again.

In the Fall, she was the Moore League Player of the Year in girls' flag football, leading Poly to a Moore League title and a deep playoff run.



She also received All-American honors in the new sport. Then in the winter, she was the Moore League Midfielder of the Year, while leading Poly to a Moore League title and a CIF-SS championship appearance. At the same time, she was playing on Poly's varsity basketball team, which won the Moore League title as she was named second team All-League.

In the Spring, McLyn played with the school's softball team, and was part of Poly's first-ever CIF-SS softball championship. She has signed a scholarship with Washington State to play NCAA soccer, becoming the third McLyn sister to sign D1 out of Poly High. McLyn's two Moore League POYs plus a third all-league nod, in addition to three team league titles and a CIF-SS team title, are believed to be unprecedented.



JOVANI RUFF POLY BOYS BASKETBALL

Jovani Ruff made history this year, finishing a four-year varsity career at Long Beach Poly with 2,073 points, the most of any high school basketball player in city history.

Ruff, who has signed with Cal to play in the NCAA, led the Jackrabbits to another Moore League title this year. In addition to getting the career scoring record, he also scored 51 points in three quarters to set a new singlegame scoring record for the Jackrabbits.



It's impressive to make history at any school, but especially on the hardcourt at Poly, where the Jackrabbits have been playing since the early 1900s—winning a state—record 2,200+ games, 65 league titles, 20 CIF-SS titles, and produced a state—best nine NBA players and more than 100 NCAA Division 1 athletes.

Ruff has been known for passing to others as well as scoring, but wanted to put on a show in his last regular season game in the Ron Palmer pavilion. "He always has 28, 29, he never does this," said Poly coach Shelton Diggs. "He's just a great, unselfish superstar. It's good for him to have a night like he did tonight, he deserves this. His teammates were looking for him, they want that record for him, it's great. His teammates, they're all close friends, so of course they want him to make history."
